COMPLIANCE PROGRAM ASSESSORS COURSE: OCTOBER 19th

The Health Ethics Trust will host its *Compliance Program Assessors Course* the day after the Best Practices Forum. This is HET's complete course on compliance program assessment and teaches our widely adopted and proprietary assessment scoring methodology. This is a day long, highly intensive course delivered in an interactive format with several group exercises accompanied by staff and guest presentations. All elements of compliance program assessment will be covered including the tools necessary to conduct a sound in-house compliance program assessment. Specific topics include: *Board and Management Support, Documentation Review, Program vs. Risk Assessments, Conducting Site Reviews, Designing an Assessment Process, Ratings/Scoring, Availability of Comparisons/Benchmarks, Writing the Assessment Report, and Assigning Acuities.*

Graduates of the Compliance Assessor's Course are eligible to participate in the Trust's peer compliance program assessment practice. Qualified Assessors may participate on a review panel that judges organizations' compliance programs to determine the extent to which they meet Program Certification Standards.
